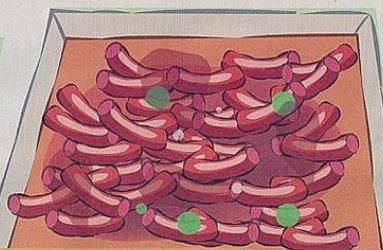
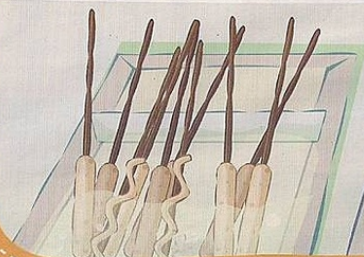
Topokki
