On March 27, Japan's Mao Asada won the world title again at the World Figure Skating Championships in Turin, Italy. She won the gold medal in the free skating competition with a combined score of 197.58 points. She looked very happy to win her second world title. She first won the title in 2008 in Sweden. She is the first Asian skater to win two world titles. "I can't believe that I did it again," said Asada with a bright smile. "I guess my hard work led to this result. 

# Endangered Sad-looking Fish

Look at the picture! Can you guess what it is? It is the most miserable-looking fish in the world! The fish is called the blobfish. Unfortunately, a sad thing is happening to them. They are in danger of becoming extinct!

The blobfish is a deep sea fish that can be found off the coast of mainland Australia. It is rarely seen by humans because it lives at depths of up to 800 meters. The fish can grow up to 30 centimeters.

The blobfish is not edible. But since it lives so close to the ocean bed, it often gets caught in the

nets thrown to catch lobsters and crabs. Deep sea fishing is becoming very popular in Australia. And this is why many blobfish are being caught from the ocean grounds.

Scientists warn that if people continue to overfish this sad-looking animal, it will soon disappear from the world forever! "The blobfish is in danger of being wiped out by overfishing in its south eastern Australian habitat," said Professor Callum Roberts from the University of York. "We need to protect this interesting-looking fish before they become extinct!"

# Orphans in Egypt Set New World Record





You can find dung beetles in farmlands or grasslands. Some dung beetles live in forests and even deserts. Dung beetles spend their entire lives inside cattle dung. They create dung balls and roll them with their hind legs. The dung is eaten and also used to lay eggs. Dung beetles can live up to 3 years.
