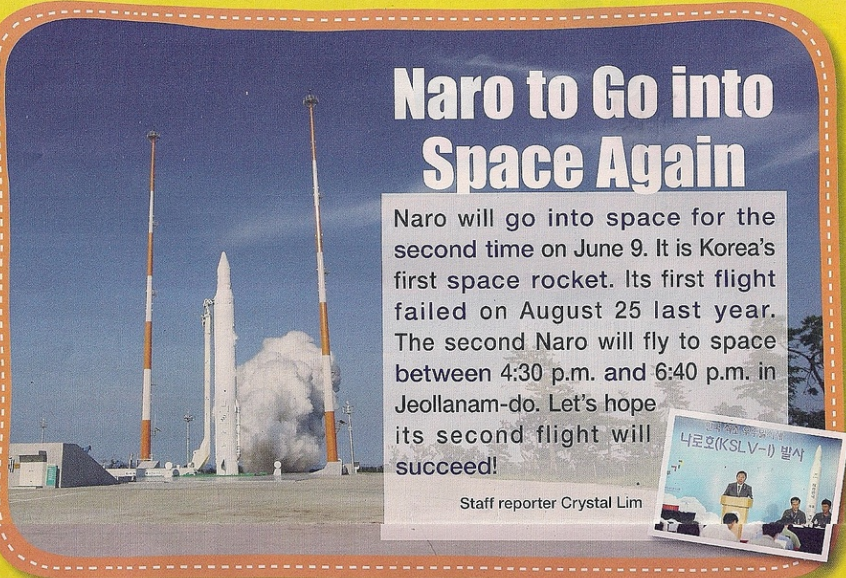

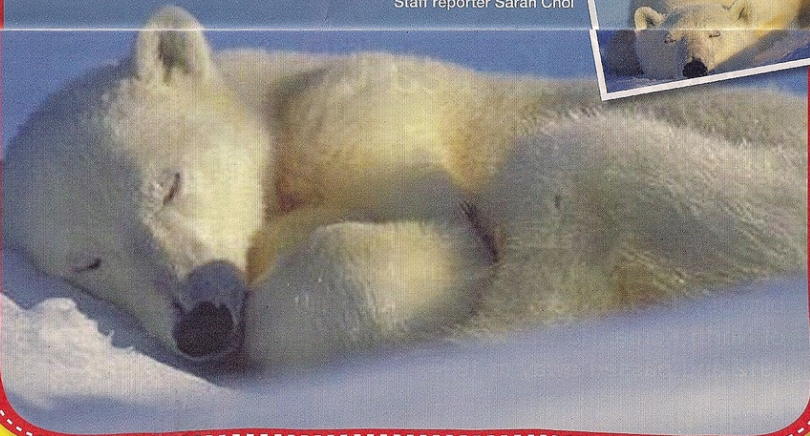




## SPECIAL PICTURES OF POLAR BEARS

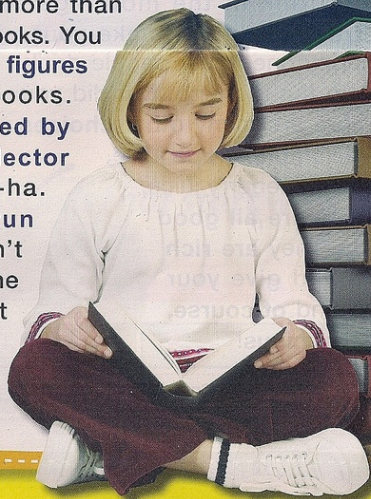


## Special Museum for Comic Books

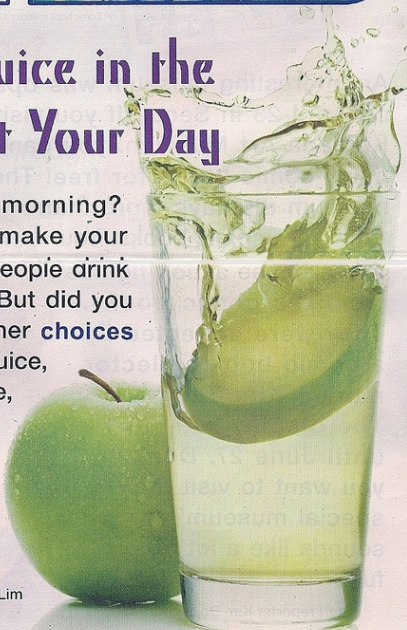


## Drink Healthy Juice in the Morning to Start Your Day

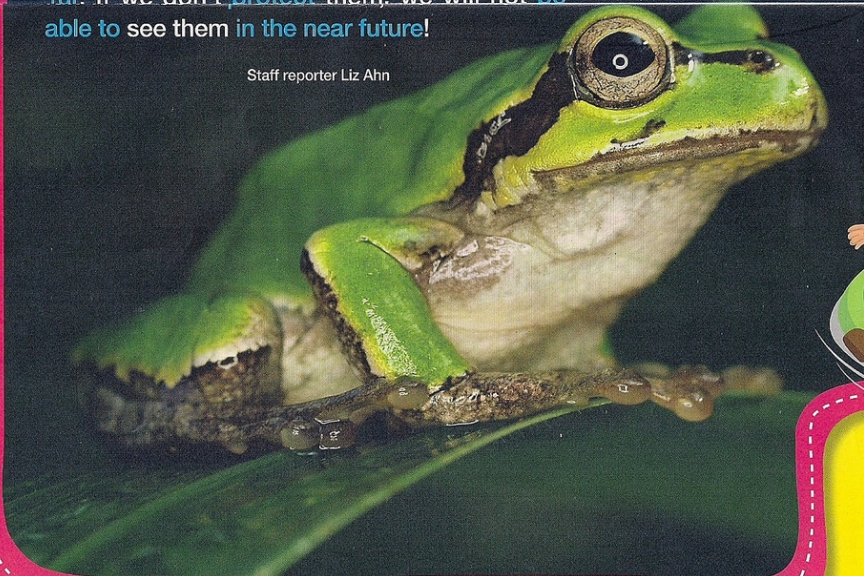


# Let's Protect Animals

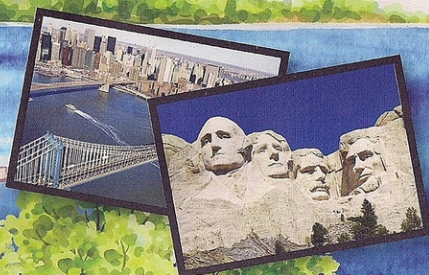

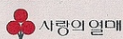
