

Recently, very old shipwrecks were discovered by underwater pipeline workers in the Baltic Sea. The shipwrecks were found during a probe by a Russian organization while checking its gas pipeline along the sea bottom from Russia to the European Union.


"We have managed to identify 12 shipwrecks, and 9 of them are thought to be 1,000 years old," Peter Norman, a senior advisor at Sweden's Heritage Board said on March 9. "We think many of the ships are from the 17th and 18th centuries. We think some could even be from the Middle Ages. This discovery has significant cultural and historical value," he added.

The shipwrecks are preserved pretty well due to the Baltic Sea's low temperatures and oxygen levels. Currently, there are no plans to pull up the wrecks. However, Sweden said it would be possible to explore them some day. It will be exciting to see what they find inside. ■

On March 8, a woman named Avie Woodbury auctioned off two bottles of ghosts at a high price. According to Ms. Woodbury, one bottle contained the ghost of an old man and the other the ghost of a young girl.

More than 200,000 people were interested in buying the ghosts. But the winner was an electronic cigarette company in New Zealand. It paid NZ\$2,830 (about 4,000,000 won) for the two bottles! Now, the company is thinking up ideas on what to do with the ghosts.

So, how did Ms. Woodbury capture the ghosts in the bottles? She said that she had experienced weird things inside her home. For example, she often heard strange voices coming from other rooms. She also felt something

touching her neck. She even saw the kettle boiling itself! When her young niece came to visit her one day, she said she spoke to a strange little girl.

In July last year, she invited an exorcist to her house and successfully captured the ghosts in the bottles. After that, no more weird things happened to her. "I wanted to get rid of the bottles because I was scared. I decided to sell them because someone might want to play with the ghosts," she said. "I will donate all profits from the sale to an animal charity."

# Extinct Frogs Found Again!



Recently, very special frogs were found in a farmland in Australia. The frog species is called the yellow spotted bell frog. The frog was thought to have been extinct for more than 30 years! The exact location of the frogs is to remain secret to protect them.

"Finding this frog species is a significant discovery. It is the first sighting since 1973," said Frank Sartor, Environment Minister of New South Wales. "The discovery is a reminder of the importance of protecting natural habitats," he added. It allows more animals to survive.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature (IUCN) 국제자연보존연맹 says one-third of the world's 6,000 amphibian species are endangered today.

According to Mike Tyler, an Australian frog expert, at least a dozen species of Australian frogs are critically endangered.

## INTERESTING FACTS ABOUT AMERICAN MONEY

American currency plays an important role in the world economy. But how much do you know about it? This week, let's learn some interesting facts about American money.

American bills are made up of 25 percent linen and 75 percent cotton paper. It costs about 3 cents to make a 1-dollar bill. A piece of bill can be folded forward and backward 4,000 times before it will tear. So, how long do the bills last? Usually, 1-dollar bills last 22 months, while 100-dollar bills last about 9 years. Coins usually last about 30 years.

So, when did the Americans start using paper bills and coins? A long time ago, American Indians used to carry around strings of clamshells to use as money. They called the money "wampum." It was the most common form of money in North America until the late 1600s.

In 1690, the first paper money was issued in Massachusetts. Then, in 1793, America produced its first coins, using copper. Soon, gold and silver coins were also issued. However, in the 1800s, as much as one third of all the money in America was estimated to be counterfeit. In 1865, the U.S. Secret Service was established to combat fake money. Today, fake money is still a serious problem. About 250,000 dollars

in counterfeit money circulates each day in America.

American money has some interesting features. If you take a close look at the 1-dollar bill, there is a spider hidden in the front upper right-hand corner of the bill. Also, there is an owl in the upper left-hand corner. On the back of the 5-dollar bill, all 50 states are listed. A penny weighs 2.5 grams, which is the average weight of a humming bird. A quarter has 119 grooves on its edge, and a dime has 118. These are special aspects to prevent counterfeiting.

## HOW CAN YOU PROTECT YOURSELF FROM BAD PEOPLE?

Crimes against children are very serious problems in Korea. Children are weak and easy to attack. It is important to know how to protect yourself from bad people. You have to be prepared for the reality of stranger danger. Here, Sori and Nuri are talking about the topic.

Sori: Hey, Nuri, let's go home together. I don't want to walk home alone.

Nuri: Ok, it's not a good idea to walk around alone these days. Being alone on the streets can attract you to bad people.

Sori: I'm scared. What if a bad person kidnaps me and hurts me? These days it's so dangerous for children.

Nuri: If a stranger offers you a ride somewhere, say no and run away. If the person follows you in a car, turn around and go in the opposite direction, or take a path where a car cannot go. If you are in danger, run to safe public places such as into stores, schools, and restaurants and ask for help.

Sori: I think telling your family where you are going is very important, too. Even when you are going to your friend's house, you have to let your parents know. Oh, and you should keep a list of phone numbers of your friends and their parents and give it to your mom or dad. So they can check on your location quickly if needed.

Nuri: But I wonder how can we tell if a stranger is dangerous or not?

Sori: A stranger is any person we do not know. But police officers, teachers, mailmen, and mothers with children are generally safe strangers. On the other hand, if a stranger asks you for directions or help, you should be very careful. Adults should ask other adults for help if they really need it.

Nuri: You are right. Hey, maybe you should practice screaming, too. If a stranger keeps trying to talk to you or grabs you, shout out loud, "No!" or "Help!"

Sori: Ok, I will practice screaming from today. Is there anything more I should know?

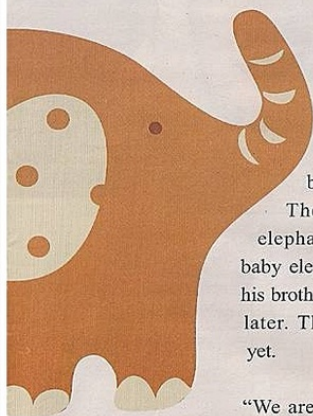
Nuri: There's one more important thing to remember. If a stranger tells you that there is an emergency or your family member is hurt, don't panic. Always check with your mom or dad first. This is a common trick used by many kidnappers! Don't believe what they say right away.

On March 6, very special elephants were born at an elephant hospital in Thailand. They are the first elephant twin brothers in the world!

The 35-year-old mother elephant delivered the first baby elephant at 1:09 a.m. and his brother was born three hours later. They don't have names yet.

"We are very happy about the birth of the world's first male twin elephants. This is the second set of elephant twins for Thailand, after twin sisters were born 15 years ago," said an animal doctor at the elephant hospital in excitement. "The twins are strong and healthy. Each weighed 70-80 kilograms at birth. We will take good care of them. We will also give the mother elephant more nutritious food so it can produce more milk for

the twins," he added.

Elephants are very important in Thailand. As a matter of fact, they are the symbol of the country. Sadly, however, the number of elephants in the country is decreasing these days due to illegal hunting.

There were more than 100,000 elephants in the country 100 years ago. However, only about 4,000 of them are left today. Among them, only half of the elephants are living in the wild. The other half are working for humans. They are usually trained to entertain people. Let's hope the twin elephant brothers grow to be healthy and strong.

# ENJOY EATING FROZEN VEGETABLES!

According to a recent report released in America, frozen vegetables are more nutritious than fresh vegetables. Scientists from the Institute of Food Research said that frozen vegetables have more nutrients sealed in than fresh ones.



On average, it can take up to two weeks before fresh vegetables are eaten after being picked. Nutritionists say that a lot of important nutrients are actually lost in fresh vegetables by the time they are eaten. For example, after 16 days, green beans have lost 45 percent of their nutrients, broccoli and cauliflower 25 percent, and carrots 10 percent.

“The nutritional content of fresh vegetables begins to decrease from the minute they are picked. This means that by the time we

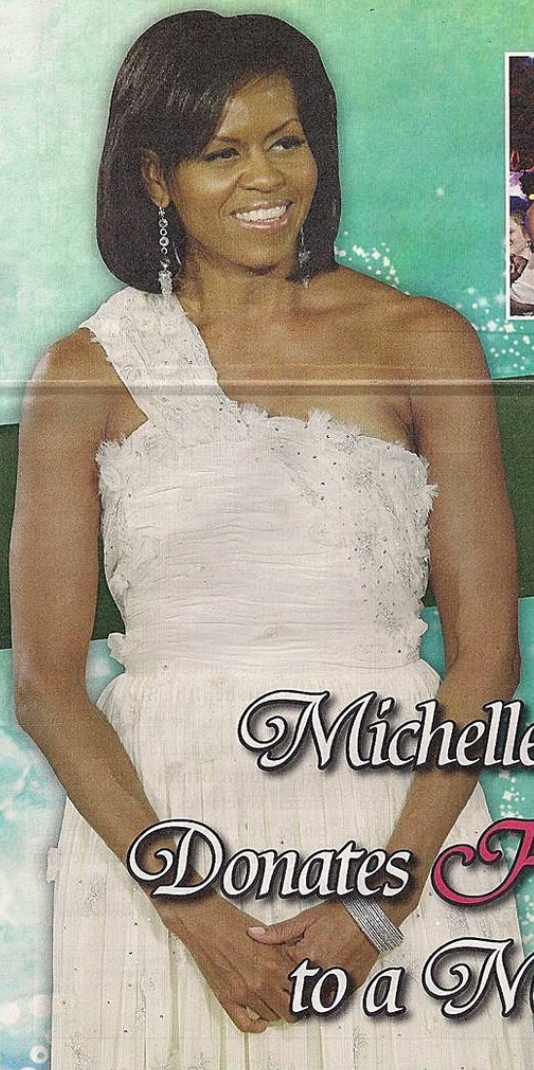
eat them, although we may think we are getting the full nutritional benefits of the vegetables, this is often not the case,” said Dr. Sarah Schenker. “Frozen vegetables can contain more nutrients than fresh vegetables because they are frozen soon after being picked.”

Eating vegetables is very important for your health. Since frozen vegetables may be more nutritious than fresh vegetables, try to enjoy them often! You can get frozen vegetables at supermarkets easily. Tell your mother about this interesting fact the next time you go grocery shopping with her. -H-

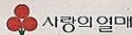
