# U.S. Population

## Tops 308 Million

According to the U.S. Census Bureau 미 인구통계국, the nation's population grew about 1 percent to 308.4 million people by New Year's Day—about 2.6 million more people than one year ago. The bureau said, one birth is expected to occur every 8 seconds and one death every 12 seconds in America this year. Also, the rate of migration into the country will add a new person on average every 37 seconds during 2010, down from one every 36 seconds last year. The American population is expected to reach 600 million by the end of the century. Currently, California is the most populous state with

37 million people, followed by Texas (24.8 million), New York (19.5 million), Florida (18.5 million), and Illinois (12.9 million). The population of Texas grew the fastest in America over this past one year period, adding 478,000 people. The figures also showed that New York, New Jersey, and Massachusetts are attracting more new residents. On the other hand, population growth has slowed greatly in Arizona, Georgia and North Carolina.

## World's Largest Cup of Hot Chocolate

On a cold winter day, there's nothing like a cup of hot chocolate! It is delicious and warms up your body. So, how much hot chocolate can you drink? Last Monday, a famous restaurant called Serendipity 3 in New York City set a world record for the Largest Cup of Hot Chocolate. The Guinness Book of World Records announced that the world's largest cup of hot chocolate was made in New York City. The cup is more than 100 times the size of a regular serving of hot chocolate! To make the special hot chocolate, about 6 kilograms of cocoa power, 8 liters of heavy cream, and 454 grams of French chocolate were used. The restaurant came up with the new menu to celebrate its 55th birthday. Interestingly, the largest cup of hot chocolate is on the restaurant's regular menu! But it is very expensive. It costs 600

dollars (about 720,000 won)! Some people order the special hot chocolate for their parties. Anytime it's ordered, proceeds go to charities. If I visit New York, I want to order the hot chocolate and share it with 100 people! ■

# The Shapes of Snowflakes






It snows a lot in winter. And snow-covered trees can look very beautiful! Thanks to snow, we can even enjoy making snowmen and having snowball fights! But how much do you know about snow? And what exactly is snow?

When water freezes inside clouds, ice crystals form. When the ice crystals join together, they become snowflakes. Each snowflake is made up of about 2 to around 200 separate crystals. Once the flakes are heavy enough, they fall to the ground as snow.

Snowflakes usually have 6 sides. Amazingly, no two snowflakes have the same shape! So, what makes the different shapes? The shape that a snow crystal will take depends on the temperature at which it is formed.

When the temperature is around 0°C to -3°C, thin 6-side plates are formed. At -3°C to -6°C, long needle shapes are formed. At -6°C to -10°C, hollow columns are formed. At -10°C to -12°C, 6-point stars are formed. The colder it is outside, the smaller the snowflakes that fall.

## England's Biggest Bull

*Have you ever seen a bull in real life? If you have grandparents who live on a farm or in the countryside, you have probably seen bulls. They are big and strong. But have you seen a bull that is over 2 meters in height? If you visit England, you can see a huge bull like that!*

Say hello to Field Marshal. He is a 6-year-old bull living on a farm in England. He is more than 2 meters tall and weighs about 1,670 kilograms. In fact, he is the biggest bull in England! To our surprise, he is still growing! By the end of this year, he is expected to put on another 300 kilograms.

The Guinness Book of World Records recently recorded him as England's biggest bull. The previous record holder was Colonel. He was about 180 centimeters tall and weighed 1,587 kilograms. He died in 2005.

Field Marshal's owner Arthur Duckett said that the bull eats 73 kilograms of feedstuff a day. He also said, "Field Marshal is very healthy and strong. He will not be fully grown until he is 8." Mr. Duckett also added, "He is very good-tempered and he likes me very much. I like him too and I keep him as a pet! I can make a lot of money if I sell him. But I don't want to break our special relationship by selling him."

A growing number of babies are named after celebrities."

She added that the economic slump is also affecting the mood of the nation and many parents tend to choose common names for their babies. "It may be because parents don't have the time to be more creative about their children's names," she explained.

Let's hope the world economy revives in 2010 and this year's babies will get more creative and interesting names! ✦

The year 2010 is the Year of the Tiger. The tiger is known as a brave and strong animal. The roar of a tiger can be heard from over one kilometer away! What else do you know about the big cat? This week, let's learn some interesting facts about the tiger!

## How Much Do You Know about the Tiger?

There are 9 kinds of tigers in the world but 3 species are now extinct. Currently, there are 6 species – the Bengal tiger, the Indochinese tiger, the Malayan tiger, the Sumatran tiger, the Siberian tiger, and the South China tiger. The Balinese, the Javan and the Caspian tigers don't exist on Earth anymore. The Siberian tiger is the biggest of the 9 species. Siberian tigers can grow to be 190-230 centimeters. They can weigh up to 300 kilograms!

Most tigers have more than 100 stripes. Each tiger has unique stripe patterns and no two tigers have the same stripes! Even if you shave all the fur off a tiger's skin, the stripes would still remain! The tiger's striped coat is perfect for camouflage among tall grass. Tigers are the most active between dusk and dawn.

One average-sized tiger eats about 6 kilograms of meat per day. But it can go as long as a week without a meal. A tiger's canine teeth can grow up to 8 centimeters long. The strong teeth help the tiger easily crunch

through the spine of any creature on Earth! So, if you happen to see a tiger in the wild, don't go near it!

Sadly, many tigers have been hunted for their beautiful skin. Also, they have been used as traditional medicine in China. Today, they are endangered and not many of them are left in the wild. We have to protect them before it's too late! ❄

## HOW CAN WE PREVENT FROSTBITE?

It's very cold outside. But we can't just stay home all day watching TV or playing video games. It is important to exercise regularly to stay healthy during the cold winter days. But of course you have to bundle up before going out to prevent frostbite. So, what is frostbite and what else can we do to prevent it?




Children are more likely to get frostbite than adults. This is because they lose heat from their skin more quickly than adults. So, what is frostbite? Frostbite means that a part of a body has been frozen. Exposure to cold temperature without proper protection can result in frostbite. The face, nose, ears, fingers and toes can get frostbitten easily.

What does frostbite look like? The skin around a frostbitten area becomes red first. Then, it turns pale or bluish. Frostbite can be very painful. Then, how can we prevent frostbite in order to enjoy fun winter activities?

First, dress warmly with properly fitting clothing. Wearing several thin layers is warmer than wearing one thick sweater. It is important to cover your neck and head by wearing a muffler and a woolen hat. And don't forget to wear thick socks. Also, protect your ears by wearing ear muffs. Cover yourself as much as possible.

If you are planning to go skiing or skating, make sure to wear your mittens or gloves. Mittens are warmer than gloves. It is a good idea to prepare extra clothing and gloves in case they get wet. If your clothes get wet, change into dry clothing immediately. Wearing wet clothing can make you get frostbite quicker.

Don't stay out in the cold for too long. Go inside regularly and drink a cup of hot chocolate to warm up. In fact, you should drink warm water as frequently as possible. If you become dehydrated, you are more likely to get frostbite. So, don't forget to do all these things and stay healthy and active this winter. ★
