2 Iceberg


It is April 14, 1912. The Titanic is in icy waters off the coast of Canada.


It is almost midnight. The ship is quiet. The sea is smooth as glass. The air is biting cold.


The passengers have had a good dinner. Some of them are still up playing cards. Most are asleep in their rooms.




The sailors are in a hurry. They know there is trouble. They rush people into the lifeboats. Some are only half full, but the sailors lower them anyway.










3 Never Again


It is 2:20 A.M. on April 15. The Titanic is gone.

The people in the lifeboats stare into the night. The sky is full of shooting stars. But it is dark. And it is bitter, bitter cold.


Most of the lifeboats have drifted away from each other.

Yet treasure hunters kept on dreaming of the wonderful ship. They were sure there was gold on board—and diamonds and pearls.


A man named Robert Ballard dreamed of the Titanic too. Robert was a scientist. He studied the oceans.


Robert read all about the Titanic. He looked at maps and photos. Finally he was ready. He thought he knew where the mystery ship was waiting.


It was amazing. And it was sad. So many people had set out on the voyage. So few had returned.
