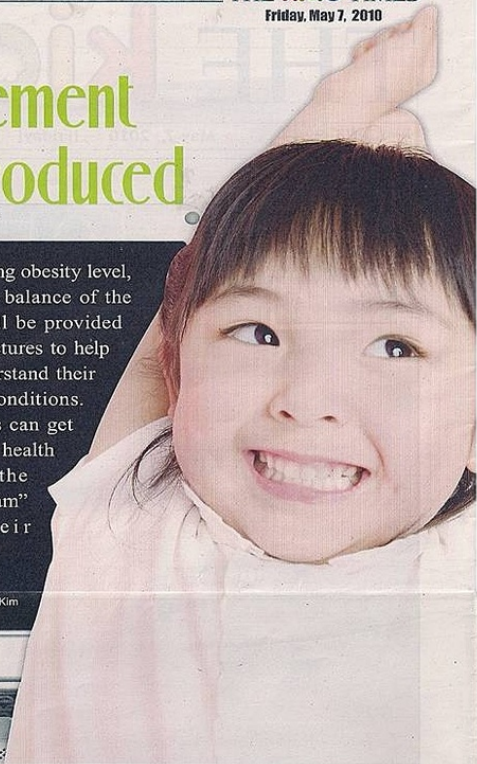


## New Health Measurement Program to Be Introduced

From June and July, parents will be able to get more detailed information on their children's health from schools. On April 25, the Ministry of Education, Science, and Technology <sup>교육과학기술부</sup> announced that it has developed a special program to measure the overall health of the elementary school students nationwide. According to the ministry, the new measurement is more specific and accurate than the previous one. A total of 12 new checkups have

been added, including obesity level, flexibility, and the balance of the body. The data will be provided with graphs and pictures to help parents better understand their children's health conditions. In addition, parents can get useful advice from health experts through the "e-consultant program" to improve their children's health.

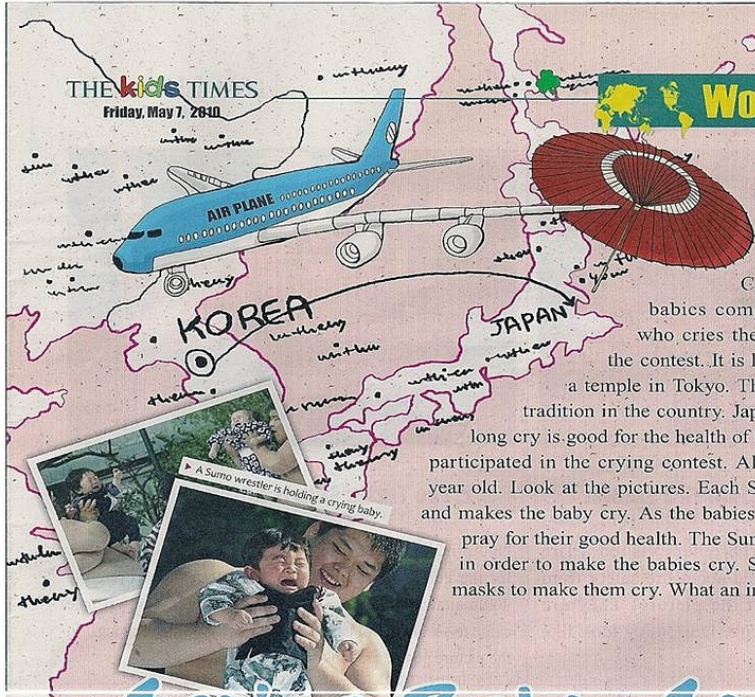

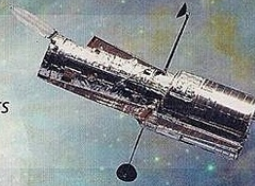

# Hubble Space Telescope Becomes 20 Years Old

On April 24, the Hubble Space Telescope turned 20 years old. It was launched on April 24, 1990 to take pictures of the universe. Last Saturday, NASA released stunning new photos taken by the telescope to celebrate its 20th anniversary.



Over the 20 years, the Hubble Space Telescope took numerous amazing pictures of the universe, while circling quietly above us. These pictures helped us see and understand the secret world of the cosmos that we have never seen before.

Among its most famous findings, the telescope has helped astronomers determine the age of the universe. After studying the pictures sent by the telescope, astronomers decided that the universe is about 13.75 billion years old. It also helped us understand how the universe might have looked millions of years ago and how the giant galaxies we see today were formed. The Hubble helped scientists discover dark energy, too. Dark energy is a property of space that releases a repulsive force that works against gravity.

"I would never have believed in 1990 that the Hubble telescope would have been able to take these amazing pictures to help us understand the

universe," said Ed Weiler, a scientist at NASA. "For 20 years, it has captured the dark, secret world billions of light years away. I knew it was going to be great, but it has just exceeded all of our expectations."

According to NASA, the Hubble is 100 times more powerful today than at the time of its launch despite its age. Last May, astronauts went into space to fix the telescope and made it stronger! Let's hope the Hubble Space Telescope keeps sending us wonderful pictures of the universe so we can understand the world beyond the Earth better!

billion galaxies in the universe and each galaxy contains countless stars. Therefore, there is a high possibility that the Earth is not the only planet with life. "I'm sure aliens really exist, but no one knows what they actually look like. I guess they may have many different forms. They could be basic animals such as worms. But some aliens could be more intelligent than us," he said. The world-famous scientist warned that humans should not try to contact aliens. "Contact with alien life could lead to disaster for the human race. Advanced aliens may come to the Earth to conquer and colonize this planet."

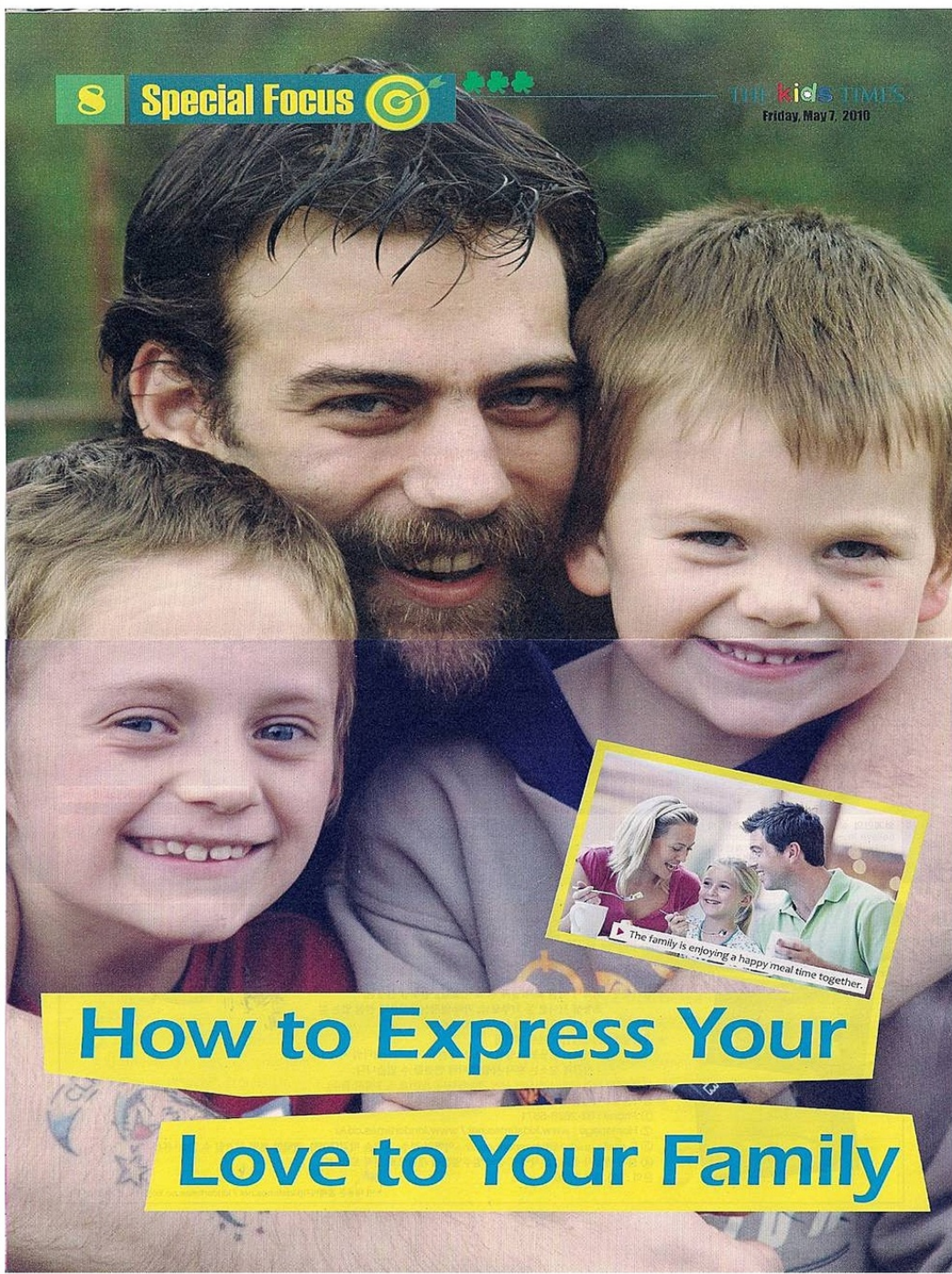

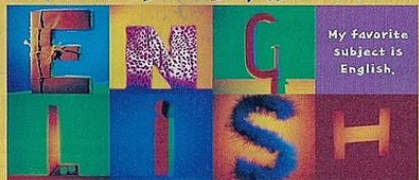

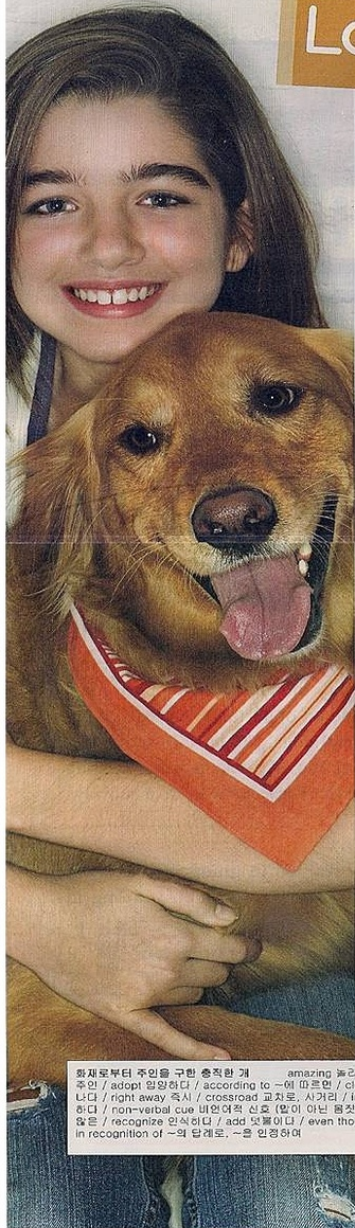

This time, Buddy saved Ben's life from a house fire. Last week, Ben's house caught on fire. When Ben told Buddy, "We need to get help," Buddy ran out to get help right away. When he found a police officer named Terrence Shanigan at a crossroad, he guided him to the house.

"When I saw Buddy, I immediately knew that he was asking for help. His gestures were urgent," said

the police officer. "He was able to connect with me, giving me a lot of non-verbal cues. So I decided to follow him, and he managed to lead me to the blazing house. Buddy is really amazing. He is an untrained dog, but he recognized the dangerous situation and asked for help!" he added.

Even though the house was destroyed, no one was hurt. Buddy was presented with a silver dog bowl and chewing gums in recognition of his brave act. You are a really amazing dog, Buddy!

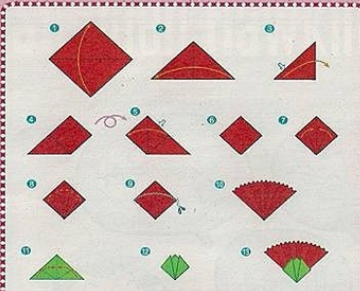

12. The flower cup should look like this.
13. Put the flower and the flower cup together with the glue.



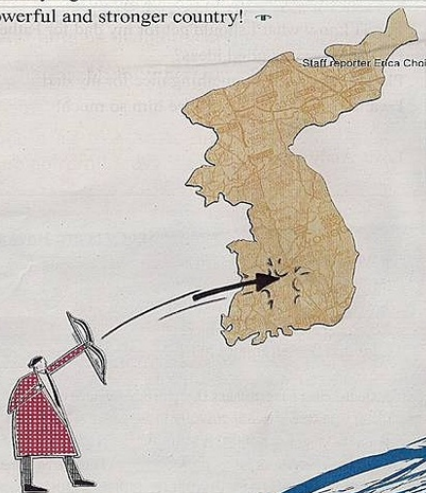

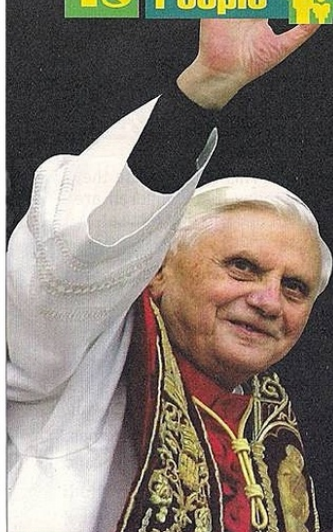
