Be More Careful in School Zones



Kids need to be more careful in school zones. School zones were designated around elementary schools and kindergartens to protect children from cars and possible accidents. However, a recent report showed that car accident rates in school zones increased sharply this year. The report was released on May 12 by the National Police Agency.

The agency reported that the car accident rates which took place from January to April in school zones increased by 23 percent compared to last year. A total of 155 accidents happened during the period. The agency warned that drivers need to be more careful when driving through school zones. More importantly, children need to pay closer attention when walking around their schools. Keep in mind that it's better to be safe than sorry!

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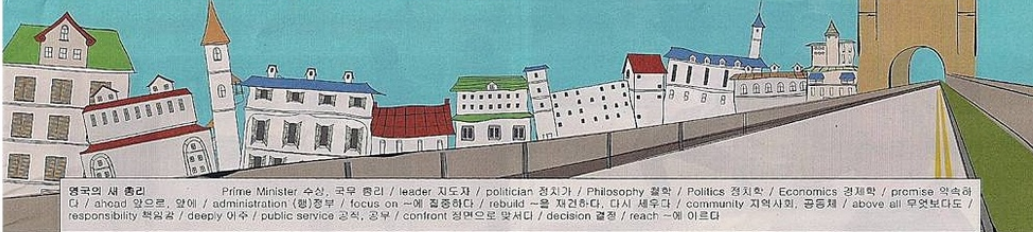

Robots Could Accidentally Attack People

Robots can help us in many ways. They can do difficult and dangerous jobs for us. In the near future, humans won't have to do everyday household chores anymore. Robot maids will wash the dishes, clean your house, and do the laundry for us. They can even cook for us! But there are potential problems. According to German scientists, robots helping with everyday tasks around the home could accidentally hurt people. The scientists have warned that robots in the home could be

dangerous to humans when they are using sharp objects. Last week, they tested a robot to see what would happen if it wields a sharp tool such as a knife or screw driver and accidentally stabbed a person. In the test, the robot stabbed and punctured a lump of silicone, a pig's leg and even a human volunteer's arm. "If a robot attacks a human by accident, it can cause serious injuries," warned the scientists. "We need to develop a safety system to prevent these accidents." Their findings were presented last Thursday in Alaska at an international meeting on robots.

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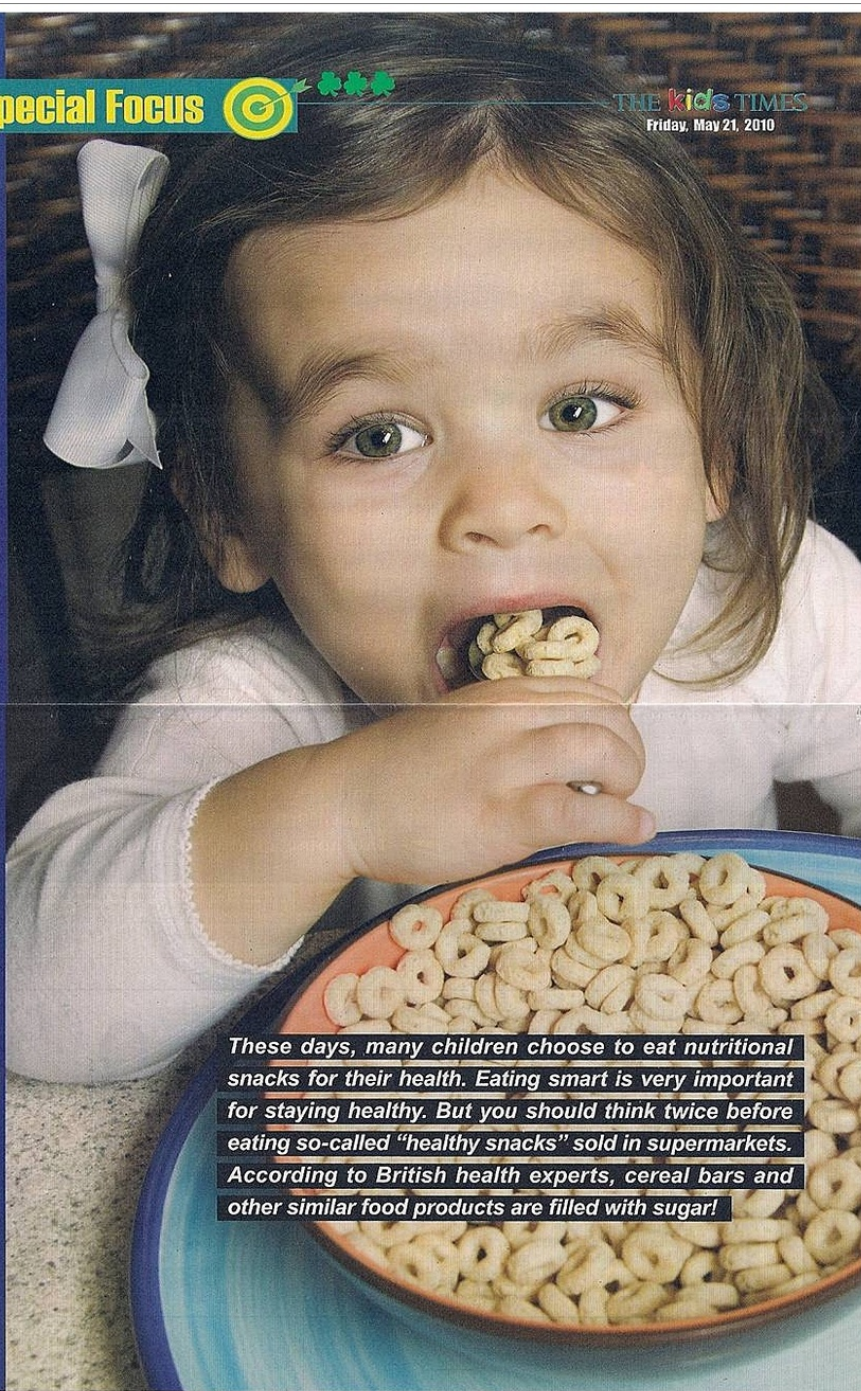
Are Healthy Snacks Really Healthy?

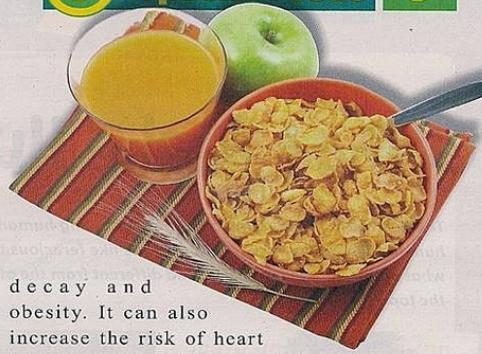

These days, many children choose to eat nutritional snacks for their health. Eating smart is very important for staying healthy. But you should think twice before eating so-called "healthy snacks" sold in supermarkets. According to British health experts, cereal bars and other similar food products are filled with sugar!



Researchers from the Faculty of Public Health (FPH) in Britain found in their new study that most cereal bars contain a lot of sugar. "We found that many cereal bars are loaded with sugar. Some bars sold in supermarkets are about 70 percent sugar!" said Alan Maryon-Davis, president of the FPH. "Before buying and eating a cereal bar, you should check how much sugar it contains," he advised.



Today, sugar is used in bulk in a lot of food products. Therefore, you may end up eating a lot of sugar without even knowing it. People usually believe that healthy snacks don't contain harmful ingredients, including sugar. They also think that eating healthy snacks is really good for their health. Sadly, however, this is not true.

decay and obesity. It can also increase the risk of heart disease and diabetes. They are calling on the food companies to cut down the amount of sugar they use.

Some cereal bars made with dried fruits and grains contain more sugar than chocolate ice cream! Chocolate ice cream contains only about 20 percent sugar. But some fruit and raisin bars are 50 percent sugar! In other words, eating a cereal bar for your health can actually be bad for your health!

Be a smart eater and don't be fooled by the advertising descriptions. Read the nutritional facts carefully before putting a cereal bar in your mouth! ❖

The World's Most Humane Prison Built in Norway

A prison is a building where criminals are forced to live as a punishment. I'm sure you've seen prisons in TV dramas or in movies. Usually, prisons are dark and gloomy. However, a very different prison opened in Norway last week. It has been called the most humane prison in the world.

The prison is called Halden Prison. It took a lot of time and money to build; it took 10 years! The prison provides a very comfortable atmosphere for its inmates. The windows have no bars to let in more sunlight. The walls are decorated with beautiful paintings and artworks.

Each inmate gets a private cell with a mini-fridge, a flat-screen TV, and even a private bathroom. The prison also has modern-style kitchens and lounge areas with sofas and coffee tables. The prisoners are also allowed to use a gym, a music studio, and a luxury library!

So, why did Norway build the luxury prison? Prison authorities believe that the luxury environment of

the prison helps reduce the country's crime rate. The humane treatment they receive at the prison helps the prisoners to not commit crimes again.

"The most important thing is that the prison looks as much like the outside world as possible," said Hans Henrik Hoilund, who designed the prison. "The arty prison was designed to ensure prisoners do not re-offend."

Let's hope the special environment of the prison will help lower the country's crime rate!



Can Sharks Be Trained Like Dolphins?

According to new research, the answer is yes! Sharks can be trained to feed from their keepers, roll over and enjoy cuddles like dolphins! Researchers proved in recent experiments carried out in America that some species of sharks became friendly enough after training to allow humans to cuddle them.

The animal keepers at an aquarium in England are trying to use the training techniques to train the sharks at the Sea Life Centers. They are using colored boards and sounds to train the sharks to feed them more easily.

"Through training, each shark in a tank will know when it is their turn to feed," said Carey Duckhouse, one of the keepers at the aquarium. "We have many different types of shark here, and the brightest ones are expected to respond to commands within just three months."

The keepers will also use a stick to train the sharks. After learning the hearing and visual signals, when the sharks see or hear them, they will come to the keeper who holds the stick. The sharks will rub their noses against the stick and wait until they are fed. Let's wait and see how fast the sharks learn the new skill!!
