More Melamine Found in Chinese Milk

Recently, about 170 tons of melamine-tainted milk powder was found again in China. According to the Chinese Health Ministry, at least five dairy companies resold the melamine milk powder, which sickened more than 300,000 babies in 2008. Also, many babies even died after eating the harmful milk powder. The Chinese government ordered the poisoned milk powder producers to burn or bury all of the remaining milk powder. However, a large amount of the tainted products have been repackaged and resold in the stores all across China. The Chinese government issued a recall for more than 170 tons of milk powder tainted by melamine and closed two dairy companies. China will soon introduce tougher laws to punish makers of unsafe products. The Chinese government promised to more strictly enforce its food safety system.

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What Is the Largest Ocean on Earth?

There are 5 oceans in the world – the Pacific Ocean, Atlantic Ocean, Indian Ocean, Arctic Ocean, and Antarctic Ocean. The Pacific Ocean is the largest of the 5 oceans. In fact, it is also the deepest and the oldest ocean in the world. The Pacific Ocean was first found by Europeans in the early 16th century. The name “Pacific Ocean” means “peaceful sea” in Latin.

It makes up about 46 percent of the Earth’s water surface. The Pacific Ocean is larger than all of the Earth’s land area combined! The average depth of the ocean is 4,280 meters. The deepest point is 10,911

meters, more than the height of Mt. Everest. The Pacific Ocean is almost triangular in shape. There are more than 25,000 islands in the Pacific Ocean. The island of New Guinea is the largest landmass within the Pacific Ocean.

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Today, many people, including children, use cell phones. Mobile phones are useful in many ways. They also play an important role in convenient communication. People often exchange text messages. Texting is a great way to connect with someone without disturbing them too much. Do You Keep Text Message Etiquettes?

Sasha: Yes. She sent me a lot of text messages late last night. But I couldn't reply because I wanted to sleep. She said she needed my

advice about some important things. Now she is very angry at me for ignoring her.

Terry: Well, I'm sure Melinda had a good reason to text you. But still, I agree it's important to maintain texting etiquette. While texting, we need to consider the place and time. If you don't receive any response, be patient and realize that the other person may be busy, asleep, or may have simply not seen your message.

Sasha: Right. I think sending too many text messages is not a good thing to do, either. It's better to talk on the phone or meet face to face when we have to talk about important things. Otherwise there could be a misunderstanding.

Terry: I totally agree with you. We shouldn't text bad news or share important information, either.

Sasha: Also, we should not use text messages to spread rumors or gossip. It's not a good idea to share your text messages with others, either. It can embarrass the sender even if you don't think it will.


Terry: You have to keep all your messages straightforward and clear, too. I'm sure if you explain it to Melinda, she will stop texting so late at night. Just tell her how you feel.

Interesting Primates, Baboons






Have you ever heard of an animal called the baboon? Baboons are very intelligent primates. They are mostly found in African countries such as Uganda, Kenya, and Tanzania. They are also found in Arabia.

But they can climb trees to sleep or eat. They eat almost anything they can find. This includes small mammals, little birds, roots, seeds, fruits, nuts, and leaves. They can even eat sea animals that come near the shore. They usually live about 30 years.

There are five species of baboons in the world. But all of them look similar. They have powerful jaws and short tails. All of them also have spots on their buttocks. They are about 50~120 centimeters tall and can weigh up to 40 kilograms. The female baboons are almost one-half the size of the males.

Baboons are social animals and they live in troops. There are up to 200 members per troop. They use 10 different sounds to communicate with one another. They also sometimes use body language. Ancient Egyptians considered baboons to be sacred and related them with Thoth, the god of letters.

Baboons spend most of their time on the ground.

Understanding Body Language



We communicate with other people every day. The major means of communication is, of course, language. But you can also tell what other people are trying to say by observing their body gestures and facial expressions. Sometimes body language can deliver messages more effectively than words. This week, let's find out about the hidden meanings behind body gestures.

- **Upright Body:** An upright body is the sign of confidence.
- **Crossed Legs:** If a person is sitting with his or her legs crossed with the foot tapping lightly, it is a sign that the person is bored.
- **Apart Legs:** If a person is sitting with the legs spread apart, that means he or she is relaxed. This posture also means that the person is open for any communication.
- **Hand on Cheek:** This body gesture shows that the person is thinking deeply.
- **Crossed Arms:** If someone keeps his or her arms crossed, then the person is telling people that he or she is in a defensive state.
- **Rubbing the Nose:** If someone rubs his or her nose while talking to someone, it means that the person is

- either lying or doubting about what he or she is saying.
- **Rubbing Hands:** If you see someone rubbing his or her hands, you can tell that the person is anticipating something.
- **Tapping Fingers:** When people are feeling impatient, they tap their fingers.
- **Stroking the Chin:** When people try hard to come to a decision, they tend to stroke their chins. It helps people concentrate.
- **Patting Hair:** If someone is patting his or her hair, it means that the person lacks self-confidence.

Many children all over the world like going to the zoo. You can see a variety of interesting animals there. Most zoos open in the morning and close in the evening. But wouldn't it be fantastic if you could see the animals at night, too? I wonder, are there any zoos that open at night?

Is There a Zoo That Opens Only at Night?

Yes, there is! The night zoo is called the "Night Safari." The zoo opens only at night from 7:30 pm to midnight. It is an open-air zoo set in a tropical forest. You can see many animals there from giraffes to tigers. This amazing zoo is in Singapore.

In fact, the Night Safari is the first night zoo in the world. It was opened in May, 1994. Many tourists from all over the world visit there for the special experience. About 1.1 million people visit the safari per year!

This special night zoo currently houses more than 1,200 animals of 120 species. Among them, 30 percent are endangered. You can either take a tram or walk to look at the animals. While taking a walk, you may bump into deer or other friendly wild animals! The animals of the Night Safari are

made visible by lighting that resembles moonlight.

The unique zoo also presents fun animal shows as well as cultural performances such as the fire-eating show and some African tribal dances. If you have a chance to visit Singapore, don't forget to explore the Night Safari! ✨

Many children watch TV before they go to bed. But it is not a good habit. It can cause a bad night's sleep. It can also lead to many health problems.

According to Australian researchers, exercise helps children fall asleep faster at night. Researchers from Monash University in Melbourne studied 519 children for a few years. According to them, most children fell asleep within 40 minutes, but it took almost 3 hours for some children.

They found that the children who took part in more active exercise before going to bed fell asleep faster. On the other hand, those with sedentary lifestyles took longer to fall asleep. Children who fell asleep faster also tended to sleep for longer.

"A lot of children watch TV in the evening every day. This is not good for their health. Parents should make them turn off the TV and exercise instead," said the researchers.



"TV watching is replacing physical activities. The lack of exercise leads to poor sleep quality." This is not very good for our health.

A good night's sleep is very important. Your hard-working body takes a rest when you sleep. A lack of sleep can increase the risk of getting heart disease and cause depression. It can also make you gain weight.

Don't watch too much TV in the evening to get a good night's sleep. Also, don't forget to do some light exercise to fall asleep faster!

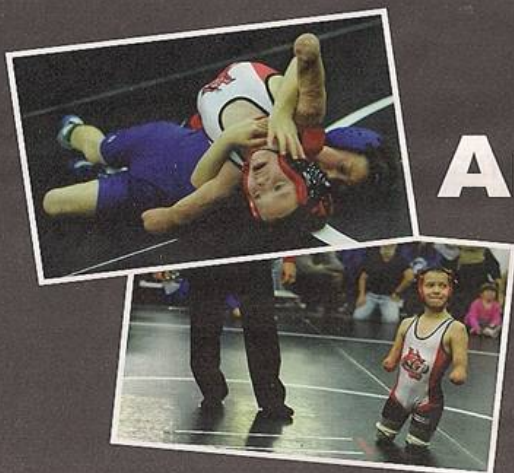

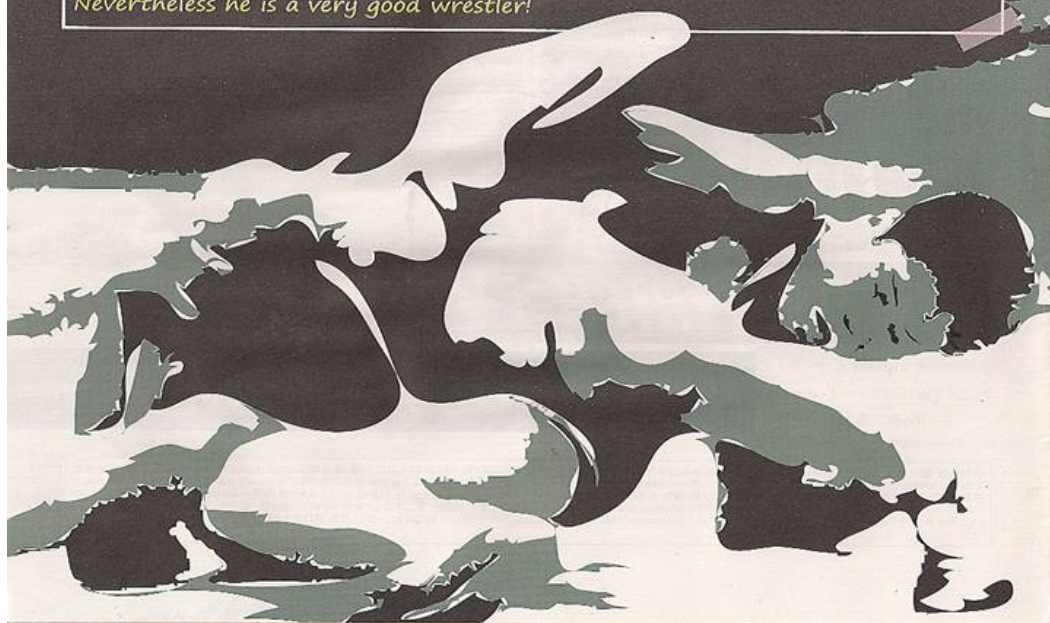

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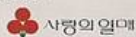
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
